2024-25 Strong Beginnings Family Satisfaction Survey Statewide Findings

In January 2021, the state of Michigan launched Strong Beginnings, a preschool program for low-income three-year-old children. The Strong Beginnings pilot is undergoing an external evaluation led by Community Evaluation Programs at Michigan State University's (MSU) Office of University Outreach and Engagement, in partnership with Clinton County Regional Educational Service Agency (CCRESA) and Michigan's Department of Lifelong Education, Advancement, and Potential (MiLEAP).

Survey At A Glance

- The survey ran from May to June 2025. Surveys were sent electronically to Strong Beginnings
 program sites to share with participant's families. Paper copies of the survey were also sent upon
 request. It was available in English, Spanish, Arabic and Burmese. Copies are available by
 clicking or scanning the QR code below.
- Survey received 341 initial responses; 79 cases were dropped for being less than 12% complete or being duplicates.
- The 262 responses were gathered from all ten Strong Beginnings grantees and 27 of the 28 sites. For reference, 390 children were served across all 28 Strong Beginnings Program sites during the 2023-24 school year; assuming the same number of children will be served during the 2024-25 school year, the survey has an approximate response rate of 67%.

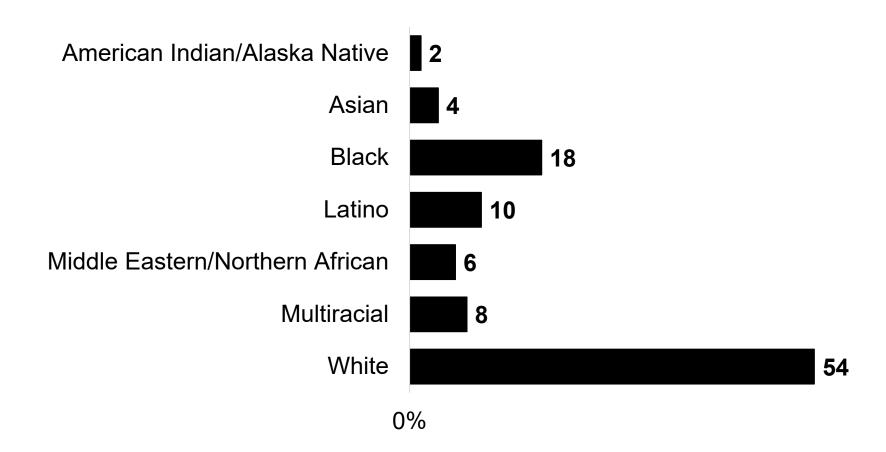
Surveys Mostly Completed by Mothers

Nearly Half of Participants Were Non-White

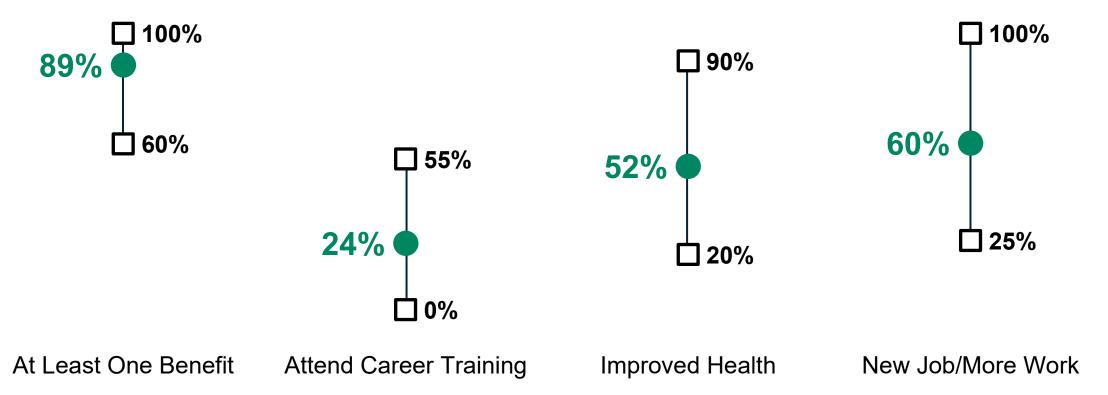
Percentage of Respondent's SB Children by Race

How the Program Brought Economic Benefits to Families.. (percent agreeing)

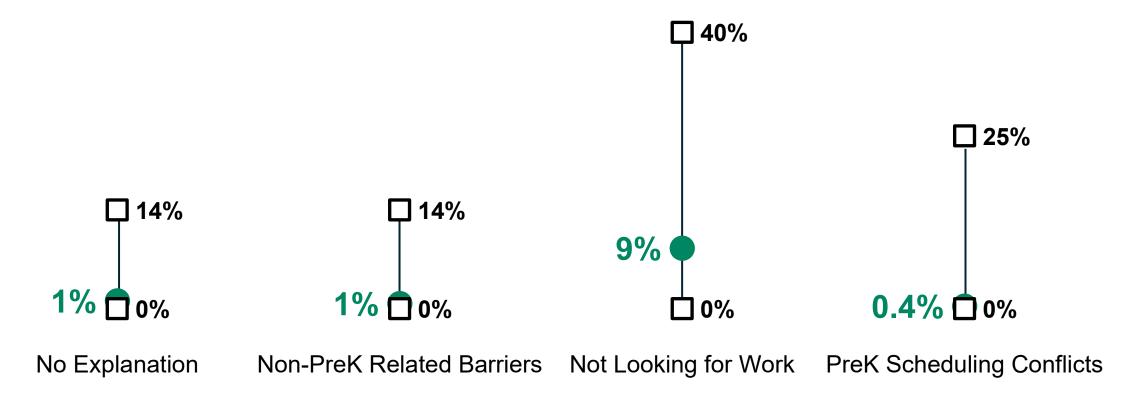

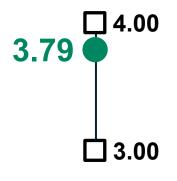


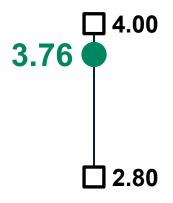

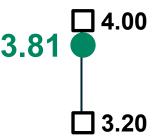

Average Score Across All Sites





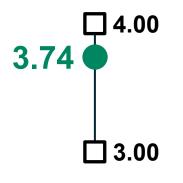


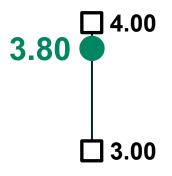

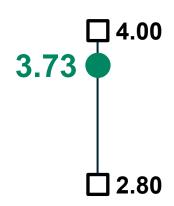

(Q7) Children Know Rules and Routines

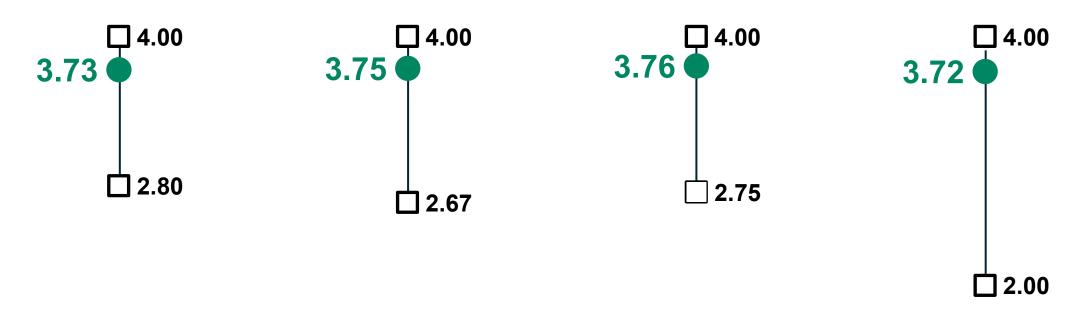

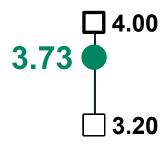

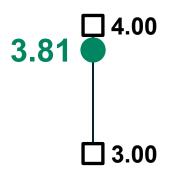

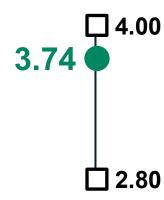

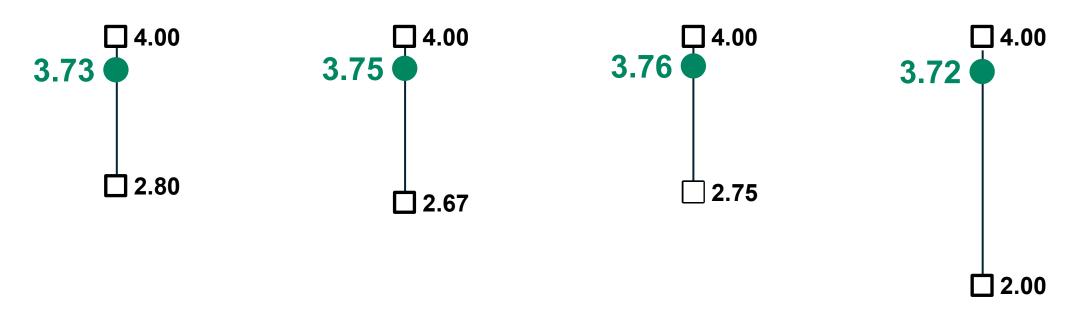

Average Score Across All Sites



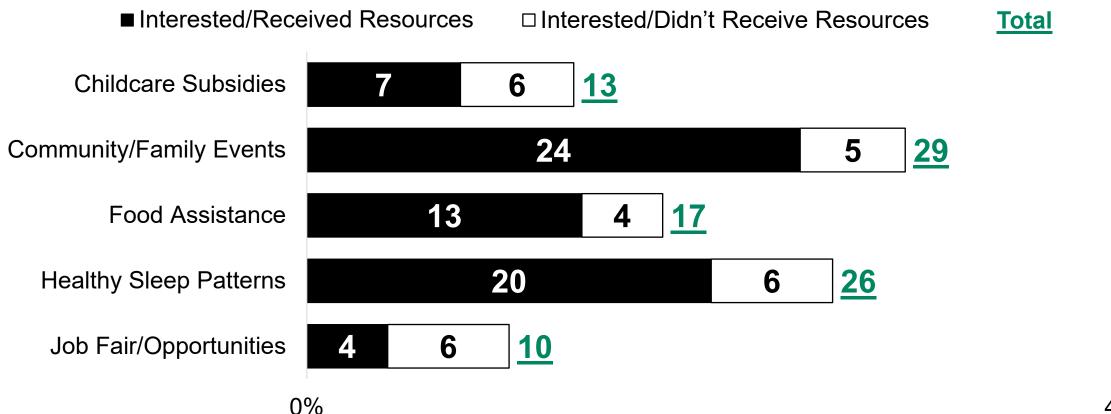

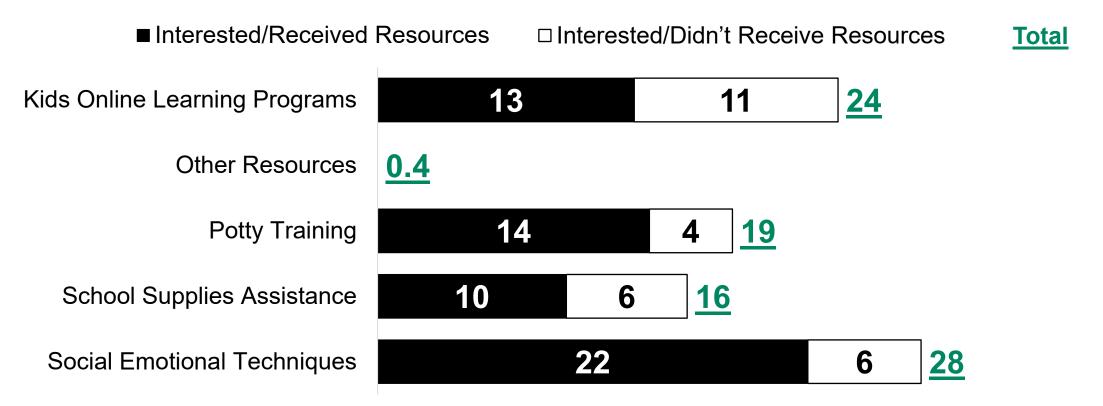
Most Families Received the Resources They're Interested In, Especially Events and Sleeping Patterns

Families Appreciate the Programs, Yet Seek More

- Expand the program to more communities
- Expand the program's schedule include half-days and five-days-a-week
- Increase caregiver engagement in the classroom
- Increase classroom resources (i.e., outdoor toys, supplies for teachers)
- Increase communication with and resources for caregivers
- Increase fruits and vegetables in program meals
- Increase inclusion of untraditional families and caregivers
- Increase opportunities for fieldtrips and caregiver-child events
